The "Just for Grins" Mobile Dental Clinic is beginning its third year and is on the road again for the 2010-2011 school year! We have completed our first stop at Mossy Head School. Our Preventive Program provided exams, x-rays, cleanings and fluoride treatments for 71 children. We placed sealants on 108 teeth.

This year we are happy to have Dr. Gary Crosson join our team as our Mobile Dental Clinic Dentist and Tabitha Carlton as our Certified Dental Assistant. Dr. Crosson, as pictured below, is a licensed State of Florida Dentist who has over 27 years experience as a General Dentist. Along with his experience, Dr. Crosson brings a fun, team oriented personality to our Mobile Dental Clinic staff. He is great with the children and has even nicknamed some of his tools to put the children at ease. The anesthetic is sleepy water/sleepy juice, cavities are tooth boos/cavity creeps, and an extraction is referred to as a tooth wiggle! We are so grateful for the opportunity to have him join us this year!



The kids have been awesome and we were greeted with hugs and smiles. We enjoy taking time and talking with the children. You never know what they will say next...

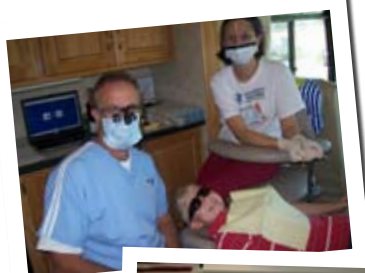
Notable Quotes:
